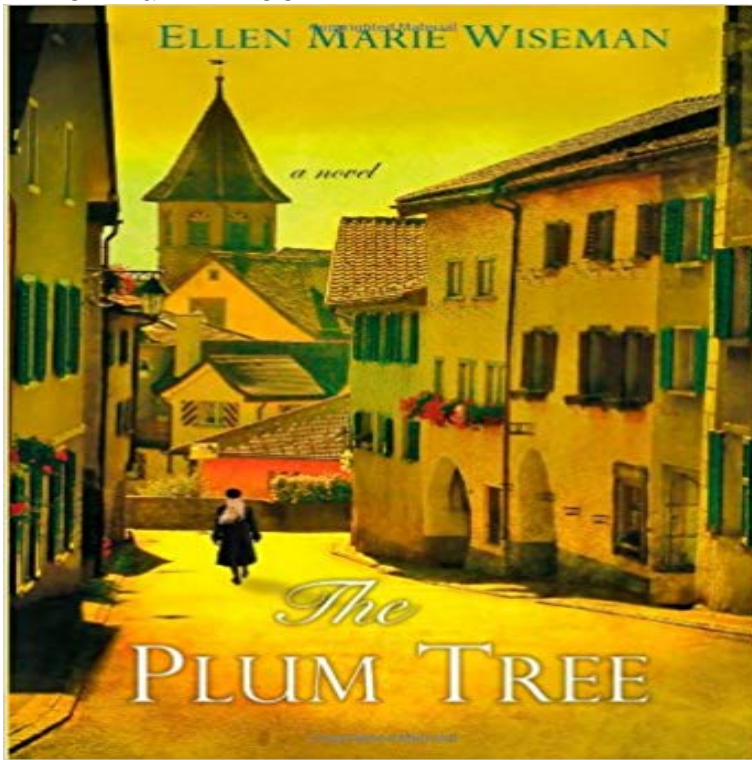


# The Plum Tree
