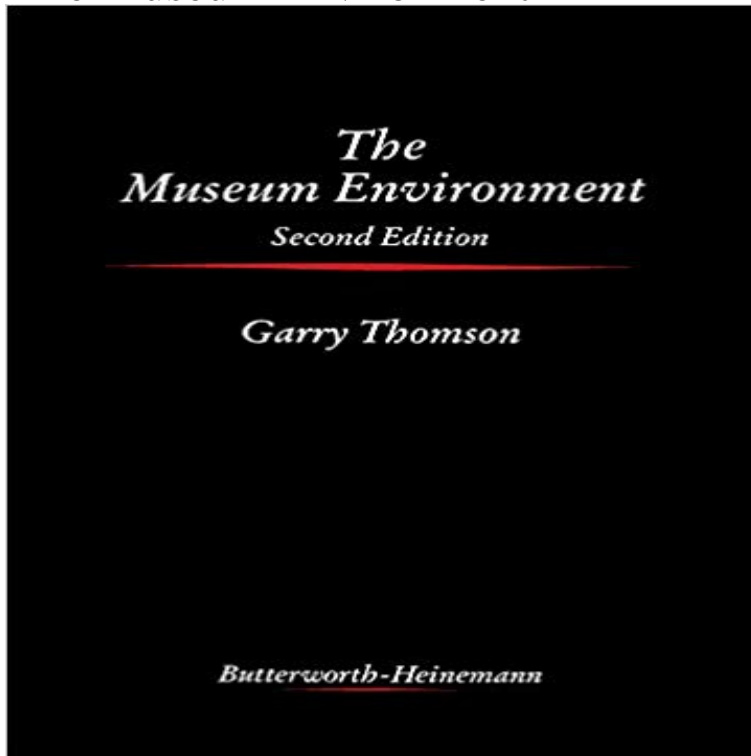


# The Museum Environment
